



Public Programs Intern Position Announcement

Part time, Seasonal Intern (for credit/unpaid). Two 8-hour days per week, as early as May 15, 2019 (or negotiable with end of university or college semester date) through August 17, 2019. Option to extend internship through September.

Denver Audubon is currently seeking a creative, highly motivated and energetic individual to work collaboratively on our public programs at the Audubon Nature Center at Chatfield as part of a team of talented and experienced staff and volunteers. This is an opportunity to learn and gain experience in public wildlife education and special events.

Principal Responsibilities

- Assist with the development and coordination of public events and programs at the Audubon Nature Center at Chatfield (Birding Insights adult workshops, Nocturnal Wildlife Hikes, HOOTenanny owl festival featuring bluegrass music, etc.)
- Assist with private programs at the Audubon Nature Center such as meetings, training sessions, etc.
- Instruct hands-on, creative, science programs for groups at the Audubon Nature Center, including three weeks of summer camp with Colorado Academy, Boy/Girl Scouts, day care centers, etc.
- Assist with set-up, clean-up, and maintenance of classrooms/center and other areas for programs
- Assist with invasive weed removal around the Nature Center trails and native plant garden weeding and maintenance
- Assist with marketing efforts/research for public events and programs
- Collaborate with education team to develop, enhance, and implement curricula or programs
- Encourage stewardship in nature center visitors through enthusiasm, knowledge, and passion for birds, other wildlife and their habitats
- Act as a role model for all visitors, illustrating appropriate behavior and environmental ethics
- Encourage a joyful, safe, meaningful outdoor experience for all visitors

Minimum Qualifications

- Must be 18 or older
- Pursuing a degree in education, environmental sciences, biology, nonprofit management, special events/marketing or related fields
- Experience working/volunteering with families for other educational or nature organizations
- Strong communication skills with children and adults

- Computer proficiency - word processing, spreadsheets and databases
- Personal vehicle to travel to offsite locations, office and nature center
- Ability to intern on certain Saturdays/Sundays when events take place

Desired Qualities and Experience

- Team player, fun, outgoing, passionate, organized, creative, resourceful, critical thinker, results-oriented, and self-motivated.
- Some experience with or strong interest in teaching environmental education in informal settings (zoos, museums, nature centers, camps etc.)
- Passionate about ASGD's mission.

Special Requirements:

- Must be willing to work at least two Friday evenings over the course of the summer to assist with nocturnal wildlife hikes
